Program of Research

Broadly speaking, my program of research examines four areas of overlapping inquiry:

- (1) I evaluate youth mental health treatments and services, with particular focus on the development of innovative methods to reduce systematic barriers to effective care. To this end I conduct research examining the role of new technologies—such as videoconferencing and mobile platforms—for meaningfully expanding the reach of mental health care. I also use epidemiologic datasets to document problems in the quality of mental health services and geographic disparities in care.
- (2) I examine the assessment, phenomenology, and course of anxiety disorders, disruptive behavior disorders, and traumatic stress disorders, with particular focus on early-onset problems.
- (3) I study the psychological impact of disasters and terrorism on children and families. I have conducted extensive studies on children affected by the 9/11 terror attacks and on children affected by the Boston Marathon bombing, and served as a consultant throughout the federal trial of *United States v. Dzhokhar Tsarnaev*.
- (4) In recent years, my work has expanded to also consider biological markers of child psychopathology and neurocircuitry patterns associated with the intergenerational transmission of internalizing problems.

Guided by a developmental psychopathology perspective, in which the study of normal and abnormal populations serve to mutually inform one another, my research laboratory—the Mental Health Interventions and Technology (MINT) Program—examines the complex interplay between psychological and socio-contextual aspects of disorders, and conducts interdisciplinary clinical research devoted to expanding the quality, scope, and accessibility of mental health care. To this end, this work investigates disordered, high-risk, and community populations, embracing a diversity of inquiry methods, ranging from randomized clinical experiments and quasi-experimental designs to nationally-representative epidemiological surveys, longitudinal designs, meta-analyses, neuroimaging, and single-case designs.
